RULES AND REGULATION FOR NATIONAL OFFICIATING PROCEDURE DURING TOURNAMENTS

- Set-up tournament jury comprised of:
 - 1. Chief Judge
 - 2. Assistant Chief Judge
 - 3. Three (3) more selected by Chief Judge and Assistant Chief Judge

Note: Each member of the jury has one (1) vote and the decision should be based on majority. In the case of a tie, the chief judge will make the final decision.

- The Technical Committee (voting members) will select tournament judges from pool of judges based on the ability, performance, class and participation in the judges' seminar.
- Medical Committee selects Medical Judges from pool of Medical Judges based on Medical Committee guideline.
- Members of Jury will select judges from selected judges for each event and court.
- Kan-sa should check the operation of court clerks prior to start of competition.
- Shu-Shin should check the operation of courts as related to corner judges and all forms needed for each event.
- The court judges have decision-making authority over their respective matches. The
 decisions of the court judges are final unless there has been an operational violation or a
 protest.
- In the case where court judges are unable to render a decision or in the case where a competition controversy is of a technical nature, the decision of the jury must be final.
- If, after a competition match, a violation of rules is discovered and confirmed by the jury, the decisions of the competition shall be voided and all records of that competition match shall be expunged, unless the violation can be corrected.
- In the case where a question arises or a controversy exists that is not covered by the competition rules, the decision of the jury shall be final.
- At the completion of the championship, no protest in any shape or form will be granted.
 The decisions and records of the championship will be final and cannot be altered or changed in any shape or form.
